

What to expect from a renal ultrasound

The information listed below is only a guide; you will be advised of specific details when making your appointment.

Ultrasound is a procedure which uses harmless high frequency sound waves to produce pictures of the body. Renal ultrasound requires your bladder to be full in order to visualise the organs clearly.

Note: If you have had a previous examination relating to this examination at another provider, please inform the booking team as we need to acquire those images for comparison.

Prior to your appointment

1. Please empty your bladder **1.5 hours prior** to your appointment, then drink one litre of water (4-5 glasses) over the next half hour, completing this one hour before your appointment.
2. Please do not go to the toilet. For this procedure to be successful, a full bladder is important. You may empty your bladder after the scan.
3. Continue to take all prescribed medication as usual.
4. Wear casual, comfortable two-piece clothing where possible.

On arrival

1. **Please bring your referral form from your doctor or referrer.**
2. **Please make sure you arrive at least 10 minutes before your scheduled appointment time.**
3. You should allow at least half an hour for this procedure.

After procedure

1. After the scan, you can resume normal activities.
2. A report will be sent to your doctor or referrer as soon as possible.
