
What is the Now Generation Network?

The NGN is a pan-African network with members from all 54 African countries representing various sectors and disciplines.

NGN members are strongly committed to create positive change, not only within their communities but also in the broader region and their continent. The NGN gathers young professionals with specialities ranging from climate change to innovative finance; they bring unique insights, skills and innovation in all matters from programming to policymaking.


NGN members have exclusive access to in-conversation sessions, mentorship, international representation, and involvement in all MIF initiatives, be it the Ibrahim Governance Weekend or consulting on research projects, including the Ibrahim Index for African Governance (IIAG). 


