News from LLF Researchers



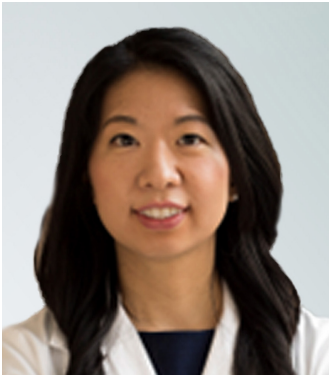
Jessica Silva-Fisher, PhD (awardee 2022-2024)
Continued to advance the field of cancer research with two major achievements this year. She was recently awarded a US patent for compositions and methods related to multiple myeloma associated long noncoding RNAs (US Patent No. 19,066,0088), recognizing her innovative work in identifying and targeting novel RNA mechanisms in disease.

Dr. Silva-Fisher also received an NIH/NCI R01 Research Project Grant for her study, characterizing RNA modified long noncoding RNAs in multiple myeloma, a five-year project running from July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2031.

This LLF associated research aims to deepen scientific understanding of RNA biology in multiple myeloma and uncover new pathways for diagnosis and treatment.



Leslie Gewin, MD (awardee 2023-2024)
Named the Alan A. and Edith L. Wolff Professor of Renal Disease in the Department of Medicine. This distinguished professorship recognizes Dr. Gewin's outstanding contributions to kidney research and her leadership in advancing the understanding and treatment of renal disease. Her work continues to shape the field and inspire the next generation of researchers.



Jennie Kwon, DO, MSCI (awardee 2017-2019)
Appointed the Gene Stollerman Professor and Chief of the Division of Infectious Diseases at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine in Chicago, IL. This prestigious role recognizes Dr. Kwon's leadership in infectious disease research, her commitment to advancing patient care, and her national impact as a physician scientist.
