


### ***Message From Longer Life Foundation Leadership***



### **September Grand Rounds: "From Garbage to Knowledge: Understanding *S. aureus* Infections in People Who Inject Drugs"**

The latest Grand Rounds on September 19th featured Dr. Laura Marks, MD, PhD, Assistant Professor of Medicine. Dr. Marks specializes in clinical infectious diseases (ID) with a special focus on infectious complications in people who inject drugs. She attends on the general infectious diseases consult service teaching fellows, residents, and students. Dr. Marks also oversees the Bridge to Health (outpatient) program where she meets with patients who face injection drug use associated infections.



### **Former and Current Grant Recipients Who've Received Awards**

- **Alex Holehouse, PhD:**
  - Received a Faculty Early Career Development (CAREER) Program award from the National Science Foundation (NSF). The five-year, \$1.3 million award will support his research into intrinsically disordered proteins.

- **Laura Marks, MD, PhD:**
  - With Madeline McCrary, MD, received a FOCUS grant from Gilead Sciences, Inc. to improve the rates of HIV, HCV, and HBV screenings and linkage to care. Drs. Marks and McCrary will expand a targeted testing approach and rapid linkage to care to inpatients at Barnes Jewish Hospital (BJH) who are over 18 years of age with substance use disorder.

- **Nathan Stitzel, MD, PhD:**
  - Received the American Heart Association's Mid-Career Award in Genomic and Precision Medicine. Given every other year, the award recognizes scientists who have made outstanding contributions to the fields of functional genomics, precision medicine, and translational biology.
