Keys to safety

Use the following safety tips to keep your job site clean and reduce your risk for accidents:

- Immediately report any unsafe working conditions to your supervisor
- · Clean up after you complete each task
- Separate usable and scrap material into two neat piles
- · Stack materials in an efficient manner to prevent clutter
- Return unnecessary tools and supplies to the supply area
- Keep all work areas, hallways, and stairways clear
- Remove garbage and debris from the job site throughout the day
- · Cover hazardous garbage with waste covers
- Remove sawdust to prevent slips
